

SHERE, GOMSHALL, ABINGER HAMMER, HOLMBURY ST MARY, ABINGER COMMON, WOTTON SUNDAY 29 JULY

Prudential RideLondon is the world's greatest festival of cycling with more than 100,000 cyclists participating in eight separate events on traffic-free roads in London and Surrey. Events will take place in central London on Saturday 28 July and in London and Surrey on Sunday 29 July 2018.

Prudential RideLondon was developed by the Mayor of London, Transport for London and London & Partners in partnership with Surrey County Council and is sponsored by Prudential. The event is managed by the London & Surrey Cycling Partnership.

EVENTS IN SURREY

Sunday 29 July

- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey 100, a mass participation ride for 25,000 cyclists; passing locally from 07:30 until 14:15.
- Prudential RideLondon-Surrey Classic, a race for 150 professional cyclists; passing eastwards along the A25 from Combe Lane to Wotton between 15:00 and 15:40.

All event timings are predicted and may vary slightly.

LOCAL ROAD CLOSURES

Roads closed from 05:00:

A25 from Newlands Corner to Dorking.
Felday Road (B2126), Horsham Road (B2126), Holmbury Road (B2126).
Abinger Road, Leith Hill Road, Leith Hill Lane, Hollow Lane.

Roads closed from 07:30:

A24 between Dorking and Leatherhead (including Leatherhead Bypass Road).
Epsom Road (A246) between West Horsley and Clandon crossroads, Ockley Road (B2126 / B2127) between Forest Green and Etherley Hill.

Roads closed from 14:30:

White Down Lane, Ranmore Common Road.

Roads closed from 14:50:

Combe Lane and Staple Lane.

Anticipated road reopening times:

Local roads will begin to reopen as soon as it is safe and practical to do so once the event has passed.

Road reopening in Shere, Gomshall, Abinger Hammer, Holmbury St Mary and Forest Green is anticipated from 14:00. At this time, the A25 between Clandon crossroads

and Abinger Hammer will also reopen. Through traffic travelling eastwards from Guildford along the A25 will be diverted towards the A3 or A248 due to width restrictions on the Horsham Road at Sutton Abinger.

The closure of the A25 east of Abinger Hammer to Dorking will remain in place until the professional race has departed from the area from 17:00. The re-opening process will commence at this time.

LOCAL INFORMATION

Local access across the route:

- Upper Street to Combe Lane over Shere Road (A25) – available all day except between 14:50 and 15:15. Safe crossing of the route by vehicles at this location will operate slowly. It is recommended for use only when essential and delays are to be expected during the peak period of cyclists between 09:00 and 12:00.
- Raikes Lane to White Down Lane over Guildford Road (A25) – closed between 14:30 and 17:00.
- Pitland Street to Pasture Wood Road over Horsham Road – available until 07:30 then for critical access only.

Access to local businesses along the event route in Gomshall, Abinger Hammer, Sutton Abinger and Holmbury St Mary will be available on open roads from 14:00-14:15.

The arrangements above, and similar ones in other areas, are intended for the convenience of local residents only.

There are no event-related closures on the A29 at any time.

From the Cockerel Roundabout in Dorking, the A25 to the east (Redhill) and the A24 to the south (Horsham) are open all day.

Dorking train station can be accessed by car throughout the day by using Pixham Lane from the A25 and then approaching the train station car park from the north along the A24.

Please be aware of the wider road closures across the event route in Surrey.

PARKING

Vehicles cannot park on the event route on Sunday 29 July from 00:01. Any vehicle left on the route or parked in a suspended parking bay may be removed.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

Emergencies will be treated as a priority in the usual way. If you require the emergency services, call 999. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained and prioritised throughout all of the Prudential RideLondon events. Planning for Prudential RideLondon involves the police, fire and rescue services, ambulance services, local hospitals and other critical welfare services.

ON THE DAY

There will be stewards and volunteers positioned along the route. If you require assistance on the day that is not a 999 emergency, please ask the event staff who will be able to help or escalate issues as necessary. Alternatively, contact the helpdesk on 0345 894 9773. Stewards, volunteers and the helpdesk communicate with the event control room.

COMMUNITY WELFARE

Prudential RideLondon works with a wide variety of care providers across the entire route in order to plan for the impact of road closures on Sunday 29 July. If you are unsure about care provision on the day or have private arrangements, please contact our helpdesk with further information so we can help you plan appropriately.

SAFETY

Pedestrian crossing points are located along the event route. These will be supervised to help pedestrians cross the road throughout the event. Please note that some existing pedestrian crossings may be suspended, but an alternative, where it is easier to cross, will be clearly signed.

We thank you for your patience during the event. Please listen to instructions given by our stewards and volunteers.

Although roads will be closed to general traffic, there will be bicycles and event vehicles using the road during the closure period. Please do take additional care, looking in both directions when crossing the road or accessing and exiting your property, particularly if there is no footpath. In certain locations, stewards will be available to assist you.

LONDON MARATHON CHARITABLE TRUST
